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### *A note on this reference list:*

When researching the bodysymptoms articles, we did not conduct systematic literature reviews. As a result, this reference list does not provide a comprehensive overview of all relevant research, and there may be additional important texts that are not included. Our selection of literature was shaped by particular biases. For example, we prioritised papers that addressed interactions—such as interactions between different systems of the mind-body-environment. This reflects the aim of bodysymptoms: to build a picture of the whole person and to highlight how bodily systems may work together to produce symptoms. Consequently, many other articles exist that examine somatic or psychological mechanisms in isolation and are not included here. Where possible, we have tried to include systematic reviews of literature. This reference list will continue to be updated.
